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STANDARTISATION OF NURSING PROCESS IN GYNECOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Women's health is the nation's health. Therefore medical institutions in Ukraine perform medical and preventive care of gynecological patients. Ukrainian institutions have a responsible mission: reduce and prevent gynecological morbidity. Nursing as a profession is based on educational standards, fundamental knowledge, professional standards and the code of ethics. The main characteristic feature of this profession is to master and combine special theoretical knowledge, practical skills, professional skills and their application in the work [1].

The aim of our research is to substantiate the introduction of nursing standards in gynecology department in secondary level hospitals of medical care.

It is necessary to prepare qualified specialists with a high level of practical experience, knowledge of law; with the ability of creative thinking and general culture. These specialists must not only carry out doctor's instructions and provide patients with care, but also to use an individual approach, to work with relatives of the patients and conduct research work on the problems of nursing.

The introduction of standardization in practical medicine makes it possible to improve the quality of medical care of patients in gynecology secondary level departments of medical care.
