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THE PROBLEM OF MORALITY IN STENDHAL'S NOVEL "RED AND BLACK"

The source of the novel plot is not literary but real. The historical novel wasn't in demand anymore. Now we need something more: a true image of our time, psychological state and intellectual facilities of modern people regardless of their own desire to create future [1].

Julien Sorel's psychology and his behavior are explained by the influence of the surroundings to which he belongs. This psychology is formed by the French Revolution.
