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FORMING MORAL AND ETHICAL NORMS AT FUTURE NURSES

Introduction. The end of the twentieth century is characterized by the necessity of rethinking of the role of moral and ethical norms in medicine. Tremendous changes in technical and technological areas, profound initiations in medical practice, new transplantological possibilities and methods of prolonging human life have demonstrated the appearance of the dangerous attitude towards human being as the object of an experiment or an observation but not as a personality. These factors substantiated the necessity of looking at the person through the prism of medical ethics and deontology.

Thus, **the aim** of the paper is to study the methods of forming moral qualities at future nurses that will help to combine high professionalism, morality and personal responsibility.

Results and discussion. High professionalism combined with discipline and self-organization is closely connected with warm-heartedness, empathy and politeness. It's important that these qualities are formed from birth though the nurse should not rely on them completely. It's necessary to develop and strengthen them during the whole life and professional experience. Also the next tasks to be solved and presented during the research are to formulate new ethical postulates, help to grasp the importance of moral problems deeper in medical activity and find out new ways of their solving.

Conclusion. Developing social and personal culture, initiating into the literature and art, forming the skills of self-organization and self-development play the important role in the process of forming moral qualities at future nurses. The person who is eager to dedicate his/her life to medicine should be ready to become the doctor of human souls and hearts.
