1. ПОЯСНЮВАЛЬНА ЗАПИСКА

Граматика англійської мови є одним з найважливіших та найскладніших елементів вивчення мови. Важливо пам'ятати, що граматика англійської мови має значення в різних ситуаціях, від неформальних розмов до професійного спілкування. Щоб вивчити граматику ефективніше, варто зосередившись на найважливіших граматичних поняттях та не ігнорувати ключові правила граматики. Правильна граматика — це ключ до того, щоб вільно та впевнено говорити англійською мовою. Знання граматики допоможе уникнути часто вживаних помилок. Застосування основних граматичних вмінь і навичок є передумовою використання англійської мови у різних сферах спілкування. Вивчення граматичних правил допомагає студентам відчувати себе впевнено.

Методичні рекомендації зосереджені на розвиток ключових освітніх компетентностей студентів вузів, розкривають форми, способи та методи самостійного навчання студента.

Основною **метою** вивчення дисципліни "Практична граматика основної іноземної мови" ϵ навчити студента організовувати взаємозв'язок своїх знань та вміти впорядковувати їх, навчитися уміло вирішувати граматичні завдання та індивідуально займатися навчанням. Практичні завдання відповідають навчальним запитам та життєвим потребам студентів, зосереджуючись на практичному застосуванні граматичних структур. Методичні рекомендації дозволяють студенту здійснити аналіз різних граматичних структур та зробити узагальнення практичного застосування вивчених тем. Методичні рекомендації допоможуть добре пройти тест з англійської мови та отримати хорошу оцінку на тесті.

У результаті вивчення навчальної дисципліни студент повинен

знати : лексико-семантичні, граматичні і синтаксичні закономірності англійської мови, у тому числі правила графіки, орфографії і пунктуації; базові закономірності граматики англійської мови у кореляції з особливостями граматики рідної мови; основні графіко-орфографічні, лексичні і граматичні вимоги до викладання власних думок в письмовій і усній формі; граматичні правила, тенденції, виключення у їх межах, для здійснення якісної вчительської діяльності, а також володіння певним запасом синонімічних знань.

вміти: використовувати широкий спектр лексико-граматичних засобів мови для використання думок з тем, які вивчаються; здійснювати успішне виконання граматичних вправ, спираючись на опрацьований граматичний матеріал; володіти сталими навичками граматично правильно висловлювати думки у письмовій формі.

Тестування ставить за мету перевірити знання студентів, оцінити їхній прогрес під час вивчення дисциплін та курсів. Тестування в освіті є гарним способом виміряти знання, інтелектуальні здібності та вміння. Особливо чільне місце займає оцінка мовних компетентностей, тому тестування стає інтегральною частиною викладання граматики англійської мови, оскільки містить в собі значущий шмат інформації. Таким чином, тестування допомагає зрозуміти викладачу та студенту моменти труднощів, що заважають ефективному навчанню. Тестові завдання здатні оцінити не лише прогрес та досягнення, а й ефективність викладання граматичного матеріалу та використовуваних методів.

Тести прагнуть виміряти розуміння студентами конкретного змісту або ефективне застосування навичок критичного мислення. Тести використовуються для оцінки рівня навчання студентів, зростання рівня кваліфікації та навчальних досягнень наприкінці навчального періоду, наприклад, наприкінці проекту, підрозділу, курсу, семестру, програми чи навчального року.

Підсумкові тести визначаються певними критеріями: вони використовуються для визначення того, чи студенти засвоїли те, що вони очікували, або рівень чи ступінь вивчення матеріалу. Вони можуть бути використані для вимірювання прогресу та досягнень навчання та оцінки ефективності освітніх програм. Тести можуть також вимірювати прогрес студента до досягнення поставлених цілей вдосконалення або визначати розміщення студентів у програмах. Вони реєструються як оцінки або оцінки за академічний запис студента.

Очевидним пунктом тестування в аудиторії є оцінка того, що студенти засвоїли після завершення заняття чи навчальної частини. Коли тести в класі прив'язані до чітко написаних цілей заняття, вчитель може проаналізувати результати, щоб побачити, де більшість учнів справилася добре чи потребує більшої роботи. Ця інформація може допомогти вчителю створювати невеликі групи або використовувати диференційовані навчальні стратегії.

Педагоги також можуть використовувати тести як засоби навчання, особливо якщо студент не зрозумів питань чи вказівок. Вчителі можуть також використовувати тести, коли вони обговорюють успіхи студентів як результати їхньої академічної успішності.

4. ПЕРЕЛІК ВИДІВ РОБОТИ З РЕКОМЕНДАЦІЯМИ ЩОДО ЇХ ПРОВЕДЕННЯ

Самостійна робота є невід'ємною складовою вивчення навчальної дисципліни. Вона здійснюється за такими напрямками:

- підготовка теоретичних питань до занять;
- виконання практичних завдань;
- конспектування автентичних підручників;
- виконання індивідуальних завдань (написання творів);
- підготовка до підсумкових модульних робіт;
- підготовка до заліків.

Підготовка теоретичних питань до занять передбачає опрацювання теми заняття. Такі питання могли як розглядати під час практичного заняття, так і повністю виноситися на самостійне опрацювання.

Алгоритм підготовки

- Визначте питання для підготовки (мають бути розглянути усі питання теми).
- Візьміть у бібліотеці університету (читальному залі або на кафедрі) джерела, зазначені у списку основної літератури. При підборі літератури Ви можете користуватися бібліотечними каталогами (алфавітним, предметним або систематичним).
- Визначте розділи (теми або параграфи), у яких розкрито питання заняття.
- Прочитайте ці розділи.
- Складіть план відповіді на кожне питання.
- Визначте основні поняття, які Ви повинні засвоїти.
- Проаналізуйте, як опрацьований матеріал пов'язаний з іншими питаннями теми.
- Для кращого засвоєння та запам'ятовування матеріалу складіть короткий конспект, схеми, таблиці або графіки по прочитаному матеріалу.
- Визначте проблеми в опрацьованому матеріалі, які Ви недостатньо зрозуміли. З цими питаннями Ви можете звернутися на консультації до викладача.
- Перевірте, як Ви засвоїли опрацьоване питання. Ви можете це зробити, відповівши на тестові питання до теми або розв'язавши практичні завдання.

Конспектування автентичних підручників передбачає поглиблений розгляд окремих питань теми. Для конспектування можуть пропонуватися автентичні підручники британських та американських видань, які всебічно розглядають використання тієї чи іншої часової форми або іншої частини мови.

Алгоритм підготовки

- Прочитайте тему у запропонованому підручнику.
- Складіть план (простий або складний).
- Для кожного пункту плану виділіть основні положення проблеми, яка висвітлюється у підручнику.
- Представте прочитаний текст у вигляді тез або анотації, використовуючи, при потребі, схеми, таблиці, графіки тощо.
- Для самоперевірки перекажіть тему, використовуючи власний конспект.
- Оформіть реферат відповідно до вимог.
- Здайте реферат викладачу у зазначений термін.

Виконання індивідуальних завдань має на меті вироблення умінь, необхідних для практичного застосування навичок, отриманих впродовж вивчення теми.

Алгоритм виконання

- Ознайомтеся з вимогами до написання твору.
- Визначте, чи доводилося вам виконувати подібні завдання.
- Проаналізуйте теоретичний матеріал, необхідний для виконання індивідуального завдання.
- Визначте питання, на які ви не можете дати відповіді самостійно, та зверніться з ними на консультації до викладача.
- Конкретизуйте завдання, які ви маєте вирішити в ході виконання індивідуального завдання.
- Складіть розгорнутий план виконання завдання.
- Виконайте індивідуальне завдання відповідно до плану.
- Проаналізуйте, чи всі поставлені завдання ви виконали.
- Внесіть, при потребі, корективи до виконаного завдання.
- Оформіть завдання відповідно до вимог.
- Здайте завдання викладачу у зазначений термін.

Підготовка до підсумкових модульних робіт (ПМР), екзамену має на меті узагальнення та систематизацію знань з окремого модуля або дисципліни у цілому.

Алгоритм виконання

- Ознайомтеся з переліком питань та завдань до ПМР, заліку або екзамену.
- Підберіть підручники, інструктивно-методичні матеріали або іншу довідкову літературу, необхідну для підготовки (її перелік Ви можете знайти в інструктивно-методичних матеріалах до модуля або курсу).
- Перегляньте зміст кожного питання, користуючись власними конспектами або підручниками.
- Визначте рівень знань з кожного питання.
- Визначте питання, які потребують ретельнішої підготовки (опрацювання додаткової літератури, складання конспектів, схем, розв'язання окремих типів задач тощо). З цією метою зверніться до алгоритму підготовки теоретичних питань до семінарських занять та виконання практичних завдань до лабораторних занять.
- Для самоперевірки перекажіть теоретичні питання або вирішить практичне завдання.
